Professor Daniel Mills became the country's first specialist in veterinary behavioural medicine, to be recognised by the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons and is now the country's first professor of the discipline. Professor Mills runs a referral clinic for animals with behaviour problems and conducts his own research focusing on improving behaviour without compromising welfare. Professor Mills has also published various independent trials looking at the practical application of pheromone products D.A.P. and Feliway and has been a key player in the development of pheromonotherapy as a therapeutic area. As well as his work for the university, Professor Mills lectures internationally on companion animal behavioural medicine, is co-editor of the BSAVA Manual of Canine and Feline Behavioural Medicine, Editor in Chief of the Encyclopedia of Applied Animal Behaviour and Welfare, and programme leader for the MSc in Clinical Animal Behaviour at the University of Lincoln.
